Current State Aid Revenue Situation 2020-2021

Projected Legislative Budget April '20 \$17,700,303

• Adopted Budget \$16,741,334

• New Data on Governor's '20/21 Proposal \$16,411,934

Anticipated Shortfall on '20-21 Aid \$ 351,019

• Revenue withheld on '19-20 Receivables \$ 245,217

Total Anticipated '20-21 Revenue Shortfall \$596,236

 Does not include any reductions proposed for the delivery of meals and materials by transportation during Covid shutdown.



Governor's Aid Proposal Highlights 21-22

Estimated Aid Revenue

\$17,152,025

Based on Data we know

\$16,960,606

Variance Reduction for Budgeting

\$ 191,419

This increases taxes another 1% or we need to cut expenses



Red Flags with Preliminary Revenue Estimates proposed by Governor Cuomo – January 2021

- Proposed \$1,386,329 in federal stimulus funding, part of a 15B wishlist not yet confirmed
- Includes reductions to expense driven aids
- Federal Stimulus would be a 1 year band aid



Budgeting issues created with above Red Flags

- Covering the unprecedented and unknown covid related costs
- Future State Aid levels uncertain
- Limited by 2% (or lower) tax cap
- Limits on Reserves and Unallocated Fund Balances
- Fear of implementation of GEA reductions similar to 2009-2010.
